



# *A. Hugh Graham*

Brother A.H. Graham was born in Sulphur Springs, and was raised in Dallas, TX. He took the hand of Fannie in marriage in 1946, and to this union she bore two sons, Barry and Phillip.

In 1949 A.H. Graham received his Bachelor's Degree from Abilene Christian College. He received a Master's Degree in Education, and a Master's Degree in Music from North Texas State

University.

A.H. Graham came to Southwestern Christian College in 1952, after a long period of service at Boles Home. He served as the distinguished professor of music and humanities from that time until a massive coronary incapacitated him in late 1977. He died subsequently in December of 1980.

His musical influence has been felt all over the brotherhood and he has carried this sentiment to Europe and abroad. A.H. Graham is endeared as a professional and respected as a Christian. He is loved as a person and we honor him as a musical genius.

This testimony of respect for such an adept and proficient man is necessary because of his honorable mannerisms, his attitude and values, and his philosophy of life.

A.H. Graham was a proficient pianist, an accomplished violinist, a strong Music Theorist, and outstanding Composer and a devout Christian.
